

## LIBRARY CARDS

Many Patrons will agree that their library card is one of the most important in their wallet. Getting a card is easy. Simply present a photo I.D. and proof of address. People living within the Salem city limits pay for library privileges through real estate and personal property taxes. So, there is no charge to signup. Because folks living outside the city limits do not pay these taxes, they pay the library directly for the same privileges. The cost is \$25.00 for a six month membership or \$50.00 for an annual membership.

We also want to stress that anyone is allowed to use the library. The only reason you need a library card is to check out items. Even if you do not have a card, you are more than welcome to visit the library; find a place to read a book off the shelves; participate in programs; and so much more! There is also a paperback trade program where you can bring in pocket-sized paperbacks and exchange them for select pocket-sized paperbacks in our sale room. There is also always a 50¢ book sale. Discarded magazines are available and are free to take.

#### MISSOURI EVERGREEN



Salem Public Library is part of the Missouri Evergreen consortium. This means that we share resources with over 50 other libraries throughout the state. So, if there is something that you wish to read,

watch, or listen to that is not part of Salem's collection, odds are that it can be borrowed from one of these other libraries. A request, or hold, may be placed for that item. It is then delivered to Salem Public Library via courier at no cost to you. You may be called, texted, or emailed when the item is available for circulation.



The Libby app is the easiest way to get started with digital books, audiobooks, and magazines from your public library!

- Install the Libby app from the app store on your Android or IOS (iPhone/iPad/iPod touch) device. Or, visit libbyapp.com in your Chrome, Firefox, Safari, or Edge browser.
- In Libby, follow the prompts to find your library and sign in with a valid card number.
- Browse your library's collection and borrow a title.
- Borrowed titles appear on your *Shelf* and download to the app automatically when you're on WI-FI, so you can read them when you're offline.
  - Tap Read With... to choose whether you'd like to open a book in Kindle or Libby.
  - Tap Open In Libby, Open Magazine, or Open Audiobook to start reading or listening in the app.
  - Tap Manage Loan to see options like Renew and Return.

Summer rules. Spring flowers have become fruit so the August moon is the fruit moon.

Some call it the sturgeon, red, green corn or grain moon. I like fruit, so I decided to try one of JoAnne Fluke's murder mysteries: the "Blueberry Muffin Murder".

One of the reasons to read this book and her other mysteries is to try some of her recipes. This book had six delicious sounding cookie recipes and an interesting take on a grilled cheese sandwich. The mystery is a typical cozy one.

This is part, not the first, of a series set in Lake Eden with Hannah as the amateur detective. Even so, it wasn't hard to place the different characters. Clues are dropped into the busy preparations and events of a Winter Carnival. I did decide on the guilty person before the end of the book, but still enjoyed reading it.
