

REVIEW

Book Review: "Hiss and Tell" by Rita Mae Brown

Summer is in full swing and reading time is in short supply. That is when light, fast reading books are great. Romances, westerns and mysteries fit this well.

My preference is mystery, cozy mystery. This summer I am revisiting the Cat Who books to start with. The series begins with "The Cat Who Could Read Backwards".

As with most series, the first is as much an introduction for both the author and reader to the characters as it is the story. Qwilleran (the spelling is part of his character) is the main human character in this series.

This middle-aged journalist starts work for the Daily Fluxion as a feature writer assigned to do profiles of local artists. The assignment is a far cry from his former positions, but he has little choices he needs the job.

When Qwilleran rents an apartment from the local and hated art critic, he becomes a cat sitter for the second main character: the Siamese cat Kao K'o-Kung known later simply by Koko.

Of course, there are murders. Two are definite. A third might be an accident. And Koko plays a big part in solving the crimes. Qwilleran follows the cat and calls the police.

The third main character, the female Siamese called Yum Yum, joins the group in the second book in the series, "The Cat Who Ate Danish Modern". The trio end up moving to the Michigan Upper Peninsula later in the series which appealed to me as I was living there when I first read many of these books.

This series fits the criteria for summer reading. The books are light reading, fun and fast, perfect for relaxing at the end of a long day.

There are many such series available. Summer is the perfect time to try a new series or revisit an old one. If you like cat mysteries, the Cat Who series is one to try.
