

BATTY FOR BATS PROGRAM





BLIND DATE WITH A BOOK!




Take a chance! Check out a book based on its profile. You might discover a new (or old) favorite!

LIBRARY CARDS

Many Patrons will agree that their library card is one of the most important in their wallet. Getting a card is easy. Simply present a photo I.D. and proof of address. People living within the Salem city limits pay for library privileges through real estate and personal property taxes. So, there is no charge to sign-up. Because folks living outside the city limits do not pay these taxes, they pay the library directly for the same privileges. The cost is \$25.00 for a six month membership or \$50.00 for an annual membership.

We also want to stress that anyone is allowed to use the library. The only reason you need a library card is to check out items. Even if you do not have a card, you are more than welcome to visit the library; find a place to read a book off the shelves; participate in programs; and so much more! There is also a paperback trade program where you can bring in pocket-sized paperbacks and exchange them for select pocket-sized paperbacks in our sale room. There is also always a 50¢ book sale. Discarded magazines are available and are free to take.

MISSOURI EVERGREEN



Salem Public Library is part of the Missouri Evergreen consortium. This means that we share resources with over 50 other libraries throughout the state. So, if there is something that you wish to read, watch, or listen to that is not part of Salem's collection, odds are that it can be borrowed from one of these other libraries. A request, or hold, may be placed for that item. It is then delivered to Salem Public Library via courier at no cost to you. You may be called, texted, or emailed when the item is available for circulation.



Libby.

The Libby app is the easiest way to get started with digital books, audiobooks, and magazines from your public library!

- 1 Install the Libby app from the app store on your Android or IOS (iPhone/iPad/iPod touch) device. Or, visit libbyapp.com in your Chrome, Firefox, Safari, or Edge browser.
- 2 In Libby, follow the prompts to find your library and sign in with a valid card number.
- 3 Browse your library's collection and borrow a title.
- 4 Borrowed titles appear on your **Shelf** and download to the app automatically when you're on WI-FI, so you can read them when you're offline.
 - Tap **Read With...** to choose whether you'd like to open a book in Kindle or Libby.
 - Tap **Open In Libby, Open Magazine, or Open Audiobook** to start reading or listening in the app.
 - Tap **Manage Loan** to see options like **Renew** and **Return**.

FEBRUARY BOOK REVIEW

Our look at the states begins in New England. I started with a fascinating book, “On Time and Turtles” by Sy Montgomery. Did you know our three-toed box turtles can live a hundred years as can common snapping turtles? Turtles have existed millions of years surviving mass extinctions and climatic changes. They are not surviving humans. This book is about several turtle rescue organizations in New England, mostly one based in Massachusetts. Rescued turtles include those hit by vehicles (Did you know turtles can sometimes regrow their spinal cords?), abandoned pet turtles, confiscated illegal shipments. Their greatest enemy is greed followed by vehicles they can’t really see. Of course, there are several cozy mystery series set in New England from the “Murder She Wrote” in Maine to one set in a bookstore by Lorna Barrett. I sampled this series with “Bookplate Special” and found it an easy read plus some good recipes in the back. Browsing through the juvenile shelves I came across “How Tia Lola Learned to Teach” by Julia Alvarez. Tia Lola (Aunt Lola) is from the Dominican Republic and is living with family in Vermont. This is part of a series that introduces the reader to Spanish through simple stories about a family living in Vermont.

“Redcoats and Petticoats” by Katherine Kirkpatrick is a picture book about spies in Massachusetts during the Revolutionary War.

Karen GoatKeeper is a local author with several books on library shelves including “Hopes, Dreams and Reality” which looks at the divide between rural and urban living.
