REVIEW

Book Review: "Hiss and Tell" by Rita Mae Brown

As I left the library the other day, I got waylaid by the New Book Shelf. Those lines of books draw me like a magnet as I've found many interesting books hiding on it.

For those who haven't had the pleasure of checking these shelves out, they are located right after you enter the library and turn toward the right. One side has books reflecting a theme such as St. Patrick's Day or Poetry Month. The other side holds the new books.

I've found "The Owens Sisters", "You'd Never Believe What happened to Lacey", "The Doctors Blackwell", "Hidden Figures", the James cat mysteries and more. This time I found "Hiss and Tell", the latest entry in the Mrs. Murphy series by Rita Mae Brown.

Brown writes a number of series as well as stand alone books. I've read several of the different ones, but enjoy the Mrs. Murphy ones the best. Yes, these are cat murder mysteries revolving around 'Harry' Harristeen and her animal companions: cats Mrs.

Murphy and Pewter; and dog Tucker joined in this one by Irish wolfhound Pirate.

Several couples and others have formed a dinner club this fall. They eat at various restaurants in the area enjoying the cuisine. Many of them met because they own Irish wolfhounds and have a group training their dogs for not only obedience, but for showing.

Fair Harristeen has a van veer off the road in front of him. Several men bail out and run. Later one of them turns up shot to death. Harry wants to know why. When two more turn up dead, the mystery deepens. None of the men have any identification. All of them have fentanyl in their systems.

Interspersed with the mystery chapters is the ongoing tale of the original people in this Virginia valley, set in 1789. They are setting up the first steeplechase race. I found the mystery a bit too preachy about the dangers of fentanyl. It also moved rather slowly. Since the mystery involved the Irish wolfhounds, Mrs. Murphy and Pewter weren't as prominent as usual.

However, I will keep an eye on the New Book shelves in case something else I find too appealing to forgo appears. Check them out the next time you stop by the library.
